WELCOME to the second issue of the DBA Newsletter. We are making great progress, including a well attended public meeting in May. We're not just concerned with people's complaints (although there are some, as you will see), but also want to bring some fun into everyone's lives with social activities

Some of the items discussed recently are:

- Liaison with De Beauvoir, Lockner and Kingsgate Estates: we all agreed we want to work jointly as far as possible, especially on issues concerning us all such as activities for local children, social events and planning issues.
- Constitution: We planned to register the DBA with the Charities Commission but discover we do not qualify – not enough income (in fact, we don't have any)! Hopefully that will change when officers are elected - see notice on page 6.
- **Summer Event** in De Beauvoir Square: work on this has been steaming ahead thanks to a dedicated group of people. Date for your diary - **3 September, 2–5 p.m.** see page 3.

CRIME FIGURES

Due to recent London terrorist attacks our Community Beat Officer, Jamie Shaw, and other local police have been overwhelmed with work, consequently the crime figures for De Beauvoir are not available for this issue. We offer the Police our support in these difficult and tragic times.

NEWS FROM THE LOCKNER ESTATE

Our main concern is the problem of drugs and prostitution on our Estate. Police have been invited to Committee Meetings and even offered use of the Lockner/Kingsgate Association's community office as a venue for a police surgery, but no response. We fear we will lose our cleaner because of debris left by drug users and prostitutes on our staircases.

Apparently one tenant has recently been evicted for immoral behaviour and drug use but we believe there are at least a couple more. Incidents and details of cars being used for drug dealing have been reported to the police, but, again, no action has been taken. **POLICE PLEASE TAKE NOTE! THE RESIDENTS OF LOCKNER NEED YOUR HELP!!**

The play area has recently been resurfaced and negotiations are on-going with the Council to try and get our football pitch upgraded - replacement fencing and a resurfaced pitch. It is hoped there will be Council funding for the work and completion later this year.

NEWS FROM THE DE BEAUVOIR ESTATE

Good news... Hopes for August opening of a youth club on Balmes Road run by CRIB Youth Clubs. We wish it every success.

Urgent estate improvements needed...

- The only estate in Hackney with **open refuse skips** - a health risk, unsightly and an encouragement to fly-tippers. Tenants have fought for installation of Paladin bins and one already serves Rozel Court. We hope the Council actions Paladin replacements by year end.
- **And removal of Garchy systems from flats** (large sinks for kitchen waste, water filled, which run down to pits under the flats, emptied every fortnight). After 30 years these are grease and slime filled and the smell from them comes into our flats. Many new tenants don't know how to use the system and the elderly find them very difficult. **Let's get these sinks OUT – PLEASE!**
- Finally, we are fighting to get our **pavements re-laid** throughout the Estate. About time too!

OUR VERY OWN FOOTBALL LEAGUE – Clare Elson

Monday 1 August sees the launch of our very own De Beauvoir Football League. A qualified, council-registered coach will be taking budding footballers aged 7–16 through their paces each Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 1.00 to 3.00 p.m throughout August at the football pitch on the corner of Downham and Ufton Roads.

There will be regular after-school and holiday coaching for boys and girls in the De Beauvoir area. This is an extension of the playground project in De Beauvoir Square. This follows recent discussions and meetings with local residents and has been made possible by funding from Living Spaces, who also helped with the redevelopment of the De Beauvoir Square playground. Local youth coordinators, Sky Partnership in Kingsland Road, will manage the project on our behalf.

Coaching sessions in August are free to all and will finish with a trip to a local football stadium for those children who attend at least 75% of the programme. On 3 September, at the De Beauvoir Summer Event in de Beauvoir Square, anyone aged 7–16 can have a kick-about with our coach and sign up for after-school coaching sessions for the Autumn Term.

REDEVELOPMENT OF THE KINGSLAND BASIN

A representative of London and Quadrant Housing Trust has been in contact with us concerning the plans they are currently putting together for the redevelopment of the Kingsland Basin. The Trust's main purpose is to provide homes for people to rent – private, shared and affordable housing. They tell us that they are a not-for-profit organisation and are the preferred bidders for the Haggerston/West Kingsland redevelopment.

We will be meeting with London and Quadrant at our next committee meeting on 5 September to hear more about their plans. We are also liaising with representatives of the Kingsland Conservation Area Advisory Committee (KCAAC) and will keep you informed of any developments. Quadrant hope to get a planning application to Hackney Council "in the autumn."

PUB NOISE - TIME TO ACT

We enjoy visiting local pubs, however many residents have suffered from anti-social behaviour from other pub users, landlords and pub managers alike. With new licensing laws coming into effect during 2005 we know a significant number of De Beauvoir residents are concerned that their quality of life could be completely shattered. Do any of the following cause you concern? If so, now's the time for the DBA's collective voice to be heard by making appropriate representations to our local Councillors and the Council.

Out of hours drinking. Drug abuse. Threatening behaviour. Unlicensed music and other entertainment. Vandalism. Excessive noise levels

All of the above have been witnessed in De Beauvoir pubs. It's time to encourage Hackney Council to deliver on their commitment to be tough on law-breakers and public nuisance.

People have been affected by noise and anti-social behaviour from the Trolley Stop and are in discussions with Cllr. Fran Pearson for measures that can be taken against this pub and its landlords.

Planning continues to be a major issue for a number of local residents. Particular issues cover the backlands developments and the latest to attract attention is the former garage behind 27A Ardeigh Road. Residents understand that there will be developments but they are concerned that these should be reasonable and fit in to the conservation area. We are always willing to assist with any aspect of planning and we are in close contact with both the DBA and the Conservation Area Advisory Committee – we don't always get the desired result but we are willing to try!!

London and Quadrant have purchased the property beside the Kingsland Basin in Hertford Road and the basin itself. They are a major Housing Association and are keen to include the local community in discussions about the future development. We will be keeping a close eye on progress and will be seeking to ensure that the resultant developments are to the benefit of De Beauvoir (see more details on page 6).

Fran Pearson has been active in working with local residents and community groups to help set up a summer football competition for the young people of the area. It is hoped that this will be especially attractive to those with energy during the summer holidays (see page 2) and there has also been a Time Team dig at Shoreditch Park for those younger citizens who are less inclined to chase balls. This was run in conjunction with the Museum of London and the hope is that the programme will be shown on Channel 4 later this year.

The success of the London bid for the Olympics will give real opportunities for Hackney with 30% of the Olympic site in the borough. Mayor Jules Pipe has been concentrating on trying to make sure that the transport infrastructure of the Borough is improved and provides a legacy for all. Part of that is the East London Line extension which is due to go ahead for 2010 – sounds a long way off. The council is also trying to agree further extensions to include an eastern loop link to Stratford as well as the link to Highbury. A Dalston Area Action plan is being drafted (see more details on page 6).

Changes to the licensing laws have been causing concern for some local residents. In addition some of our local pubs have been adversely affecting the quality of life for people living nearby. Fran Pearson has been meeting with some local residents to discuss the general and specific issues. A session on licensing led by senior councillors from Hackney will be part of the 7 November meeting of the DBA (see more details on pages 3 & 6). In the meantime, Fran will try and answer any queries or follow up your concerns – frances.pearson@hackney.gov.uk.

STOP PRESS: Rosemary Gardens - a result!!

The revised Rosemary Gardens application was thrown out by Islington Council at the Planning meeting on 26 July on the grounds that the resultant increased amount of vehicular traffic was undesirable.

The developers will probably return with an application that uses the existing Downham Road access which will be better but will still not help the people living in Park Place and may antagonise those living in Downham Road.

Ideally we would like Islington to find another location altogether for the Greenspace depot. Hopefully in view of all the local opposition, they will.
